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
# The Question


- The bigger problem is reading more.
  - How can we get students to read more?

#### Some Answers

- Require.
  - Pressure.
    - Inspire.
      - Teach story grammar.

# **Teach Story Grammar**


- Story Grammar
  - Character + Predicament + Attempted Extrication.
    - The Storytelling Animal by Jonathan Gottschall

#### The 3-Minute Drill

- Besides, pressuring, requiring, inspiring, and teaching story grammar, you can try the 3-minute drill.
  - The idea: "Getting started is half the job."
    - Read for at least 3 minutes per day.
      - Trick or kickstart yourself into reading more.

# **Background & Method**

- 79 Intermediate University students.
  - 3 classes.
    - ER is 30% of their grade (word counts).
    - Spring term, no 3-minute drill.
    - Fall term, 3-minute drill from 12/6-1/17.





#### Instructions

- Carry the 3-Minute Drill form.
  - Read at least 3 minutes daily.
  - Write your total for each date.
  - · Write your totals.
    - Turn in by DATE.


#### **Points**

- 3 Minutes a Day Points
  - 40 Days = 10 points
  - 35-39 Days = 9 points
  - 30-34 Days = 8 points
  - 25-29 Days = 7 points
  - 20-24 Days = 6 points





### **Increase Per Student**



# Interpretations

- Students just got better.
  - 3-minute drill had no influence.
- Students inflated self-reported word counts.
  - They worried about grades and gave into pressure.
- Other?
- Students read more because...
  - The 3-minute drill kickstarted their reading.

#### **Future Research**

- How can we check to see if it really works?
  - Cross-check with questionnaires.
  - Do it first term, not last term.
    - So that getting better doesn't impact results.
  - Split the classes into groups (+ & drills).
  - Vary the length of the drill.
  - Compare word counts with drill results.
