

## WHAT'S A STORY POD?

- The storyteller tells a story using slides.
  - Listeners interact with the story.
    - They negotiate meaning and notice linguistic features.

#### How is "story" defined?

Character +

Predicament +

#### **Attempted Extrication**



#### HOW ARE STORY PODS TOLD?

• Storyteller prepares 4 kinds of slides.

• Tell each part of the story in 4 steps.

# Step 1

- Tell Part 1 of the story <u>without text</u> <u>support</u>.
  - Show dark blank slides.
  - Or use a picture or pictures to support the story.

## Step 2

- Tell Part 1 of the story again.
  - Use textual support.
    - Show the text with pictures or not.

## Step 3

- Students get in pairs or groups.
  - Storyteller shows a Q/A slide.
  - Students answer discussion or comprehension questions.
    - Students negotiate the meaning of the story.

## Step 4

- Show a slide highlighting 1-3 grammatical or lexical features.
  - Storyteller briefly points out linguistic features.
  - Students notice grammar and lexis.

## **REPEAT THE STEPS**

- Storyteller repeats Steps 1-4 with the remaining parts of the story.
  - Option: cut off the story at a "cliffhanger," and students finish the story as homework.



## **Steps 1-2**

 In the south of Oregon, near Lake of the Woods, young John Jones was walking through the forest. As he walked, he enjoyed the fresh air and the tall green trees. He came to an open field.

• Step 1: no text support, i.e., hit the "B" key to blank the screen.

• Step 2: repeat this part of the story with text support, showing the text.

### STEP 3 Q/A

- Who is the main character?
  - Where is he?
    - What was he enjoying?
    - Do you like rabbits?

#### **STEP 4 (LANGUAGE FOCUS)**

#### • Past Tense

- He walked in the forest.
- He enjoyed the fresh air.
- He came to a field.

#### THE RABBIT BY HUGH LUPTON

• Do the rest of the story, repeating Steps 1-4 for each part of the story.

• The story is presented here as a reference. It can be used a story pod, using the 4 Steps.
